PESA Act implementation among AAP's 6 promises to Gujarat tribals

AAP AADMI Party (AAP) national convenor and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday announced a six-point guarantee for tribals in Gujarat, that includes the implementation of the PESA Act, reservation to Scheduled Areas Act, 1950, which has been a contentious issue in the tribal belt.

Kejriwal made the promises at a tribal gathering at Rodeh in Chhoti Udaipur where Bharatiya Kisan Party (BKP) leader Mahesh Vasava was also present. "Strict implementation of PESA Act" along with the formation of a Tribal Advisory Council (TAC) headed by tribal leader top the list of six promises spanning the areas of law, education, health, caste-discrimination, housing and roads.

The implementation of PESA in the areas notified under Schedule V of the Constitution has been a major contention of the BJP led by MLAs Chhoti Vasava and Mahesh Vasava. BJP supreme Chhoti Vasava had always reiterated that the total implementation of PESA was an "absolute condition" for an alliance with any party.

"We will be the first time that a party will implement the Schedule V in tribal areas; AAP will do it. We are aware that the Gujarat government has also passed the PESA law but it has not been implemented. The Act empowers the panchayat with absolute power. It gives a part of the state's revenue to the panchayat, and the decision of the panchayat is final."

chaper regarding issues of the disadvantaged by the local officials," Kejriwal said.

"The TAC will determine how much money should be spent in the tribal areas and for what issues," the Chief Minister said, as the chairperson of the committee but what does not know about the tribal issues," he added.

The AAP also promised state-of-the-art medical facilities for tribal children in each district where tribal history, language, culture, and traditions and also research on the subjects will be part of the curriculum.

"There have been tribes in the area of school in villages, towns, and cities of Gujarat. If you give them [BJP] your vote, they will make your children's school closed. But if you vote for us, I will make schools for your children and they will grow like the children in Delhi. We have progressed. I will give them jobs," Kejriwal said, adding he

has, along with leaders of AAP and BKP, "challenged us to plan to provide 10 lakh employment opportunities to tribal youth."

"It is not the BJP's coup of tea. Only I can do it. Until the jobs are given, the AAP government will give Rs. 1,000 crore to the tribal youth to start their own business," he said, indicating the unemployment allowance be provided in 10 lakh crore.

Promising Delhi-model "modern medical clinics" as well as hospitals and specialised treatment for sickle-cell anaemia, malaria, and other diseases specific to the tribal region, the AAP convenor also said roads would be constructed to connect remote villages in Gujarat.

The party has also promised to issue tribal certificates to "genuine" tribals who have been excluded from the list of notified Scheduled Tribes.

The state Tribal Development Department (TDD), in a circular issued on August 4, clarified that the

department will not issue tribal certificates to "genuine" tribals who have been excluded from the list of notified Scheduled Tribes.
