PESA Act implementation among AAP's 6 promises to Gujarat tribals

AAP ADMIT Party (AAP) national convener and Delta chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday announced a six-point guarantee for tribals in Gujarat, that includes the implementation of the Panchayat (Extension to the Scheduled Areas) Act, 1996, which has been a contentious issue in the tribal belt.

Kejriwal made the promises at a tribal gathering at Bedoli in Chhota Udepur where Rupen Patel, RUPP leader Mahesh Vora was also present. "Strict implementation of PESA Act" along with the formation of a Tribal Advisory Council (TAC) headed by tribal leaders top the list of six promises spanning the areas of laws, education, health, caste certificates, housing and roads.

The implementation of PESA in the areas notified under Schedule V of the Constitution has been a major demand of the RUPP, led by MLA Chhota Vora, and Mahesh Vora. RUPP leader Chhota Vora had always reiterated that strict implementation of PESA was an "absolute condition" for an alliance with any party.

"It will be for the first time that a party will implement the Schedule V in tribal areas; AAP will do it. We are assured that the Gujarat government has also passed the PESA law but it has not been implemented. The Act empowers the panchayat with absolute power – it says a panchayat is above the state Assembly and even Parliament, and the decision of the panchayat

sharper regarding issues of the landowner by the local council," Kejriwal said.

"The PESA will determine how much money should be spent in the tribal areas and for what areas. The chief minister sits as the chairperson of the committee but what does he know about the tribal issues?" he added.

The AAP also promised state-of-the-art residential schools for tribal children in such districts where tribal history, language, culture, and traditions and also research on the subjects will be part of the curriculum.

"There have been tribal areas with open sale of alcohol in villages, towns, and cities of Gujarat; if you give them [RUPP] your vote, they will make schools for your children and they will grow like the children in Delhi have progressed. I will give them jobs," Kejriwal said, adding he

Surat post office sells 20k national flags; officials say increase in demand

THE HADAPS post office in Surat has sold around 20,000 national flags in four days part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav and increasing awareness for national flags.

The central government has launched 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' to encourage people to hoist national flags at their homes to mark the 75th Independence Day.

As part of the campaign, the Surat post office is selling national flags through its 210 branches in the district.

The postal department also has made a self-service point inside the head office where customers can take a selfie with the national flag displayed on a social media.

Senior Postal Superintendent Shashi Kumar said, "We started selling the national flags from August 2 in Surat. We have received 21,000 flags so far, out of which we have sold 20,000 flags till now. We have sold 20,000 flags to a school and 10,000 flags to Dakshin Gujarat Vil Company

Limited. We have got inquiries from private organizations and government offices for the supply of flags. As demand rises, we have requested the Gujarat head office to increase the supply. We have called an meeting in different schools to create awareness among students and school authorities purchase the flags as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav."

Among those who bought the national flag from the postal department in Surat are Sandeepan Gyantewala, who placed an order for around 1,000 flags.

Sandeepan Gyantewala, state trustee Raheja Ltd, said,

"We have collected funds from

1,500 families and placed the order.

The officials delivered 800 flags and we distributed the same

on Saturday. The remaining

flags will be delivered most
